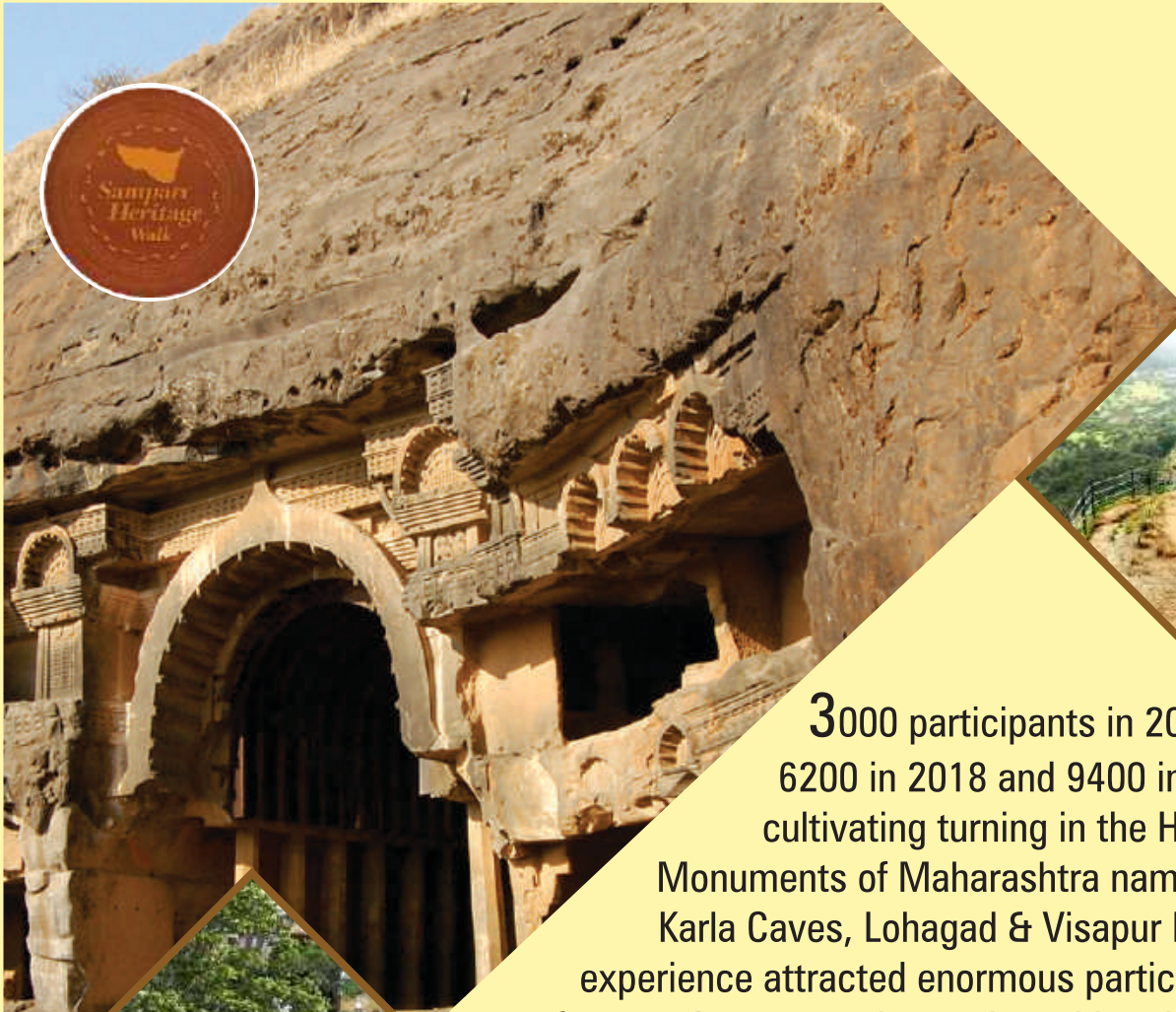

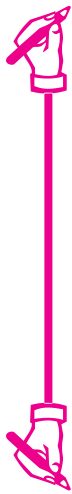

SAMPARC ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22



Mr. Anil Singhvi, Honourable President and Mr. Amitkumar Banerjee, Honourable Secretary, SAMPARC Governing Council, take immense pleasure in presenting the Annual Report for the year 2021-22.



Just in the aftermath of recovering from COVID impact SAMPARC realized 2021-22 is becoming very challenging and full of work is required to

to restore normalcy in the life of children and working people of the organization. We are pleased to inform everyone that we have overcome our hurdles and gradually restored normalcy in the life of children and working members of Organization.



At the same time, we restored our close relation with 16 villages in Maval Taluka for our Health & Tribal Programs. During this year we also started working with two more Talukas – Bhor & Velha where we are working with 23 villages for education & livelihood development of Tribal Beneficiaries.

We are already working with 59 villages in Mulshi Taluka in Dist. Pune for Tribal Development and old 40 villages in Maval Taluka of Pune District for Women Empowerment.

Similarly, SAMPARC has strengthened its Community Relation in Gangani in Jodhpur, Baragaon in Varnasi and South 24 Pargana in West Bengal. All our Balgrams for carrying on with activities for orphan & destitute children in Bhaje,



Poynad, Shel-Pimpalgaon, Bal Asha Ghar, in Maharashtra, Gangani in Jodhpur, Rajasthan, and Tollygunge, Haridevpur in Kolkata, West Bengal. In each of our Balgram the number of children are full and as per the sanction by respective Government authorities.



Our 3 Schools & Junior Colleges in village Bhambarde, Mulshi Taluka; Malavli and Patan, Maval Taluka in Dist. Pune are running smoothly and with full capacity of students.

Our Skill Development Training Institutes in Malavli, Pune and in Namapur, Varnasi are functioning properly.

SAMPARC has also re-established Women Self Help Group activities in surrounding villages of Malavli. In addition, the Family Counselling Centre is running efficiently.

The most important Community support work is our Community Health Care Program in which 2 Medical Mobile Clinic Vans are visiting 27 villages in Maval Taluka. 4 doctors and 7 medical support staff are now active in addition to Dentistry & Ophthalmology Department. All the work has started offline but still today the basic medical Covid safety norms are followed.

This year the following construction activities and infrastructure developments were started & completed:

1. SAMPARC Grameen Vidya Vikas Kendra, Bhambarde

- Bhambarde Check Dam Renovation has been completed with the help & guidance of Pani Panchayat Team, Gram Gaurav Pratishthan & Mr. Steven. They have reconstructed the laying of stone pitching on the mud bund wall and Jacket inlet seepages in the ground base surfaces and re-strengthened the Reservoir protecting wall for the purpose to hold more water and to see sustainability of water till summer. The new renovated Dam can store 1.2 crores litre water now for use domestic consumption in SAMPARC School & Hostel, Bhambarde.
- In Bhambarde all the Classrooms and Hostel Building were painted including cots & furniture. Digital Learning Board fixed in 10 classrooms to initiate new digital learning process for children. Also installed internet booster to support Digital learning by students.
- Bhambarde School received School Bus this year to facilitate village student for coming to school and attend school regularly.

2. SAMPARC Lily English Medium School & Junior College

- 8 Classrooms were constructed in the School including 2 rooms for Science lab, 1 room for Computer and 1 room for Library and rest of the rooms for general class room studies.



3. SAMPARC Balgram, Poynad

- The old and damaged Boys Home of Poynad was demolished successfully. The most part of the building had developed
- cracks due to the last 2 Cyclones and heavy rains. It was most important from the point of view of safety of the children. SAMPARC made a plan to restructure the building which has been initiated with the help of our donors. About 4000 sq.ft. Construction of double storey building was completed to accommodate 35 boys.



4. SAMPARC Balgram, Bhaje

- A twin room structure constructed for lady staff who work with the children as Social Worker.
- Children's Community Hall was renovated this year by creating big windows, changing the roof structure, stage, Electric & Sound System and Painting.
- Two new toilets added with Kanji Sadan, of Bhaje Balgram to meet the additional requirement of the children.
- Drinking water pipeline of the Balgram modified and reinstalled for proper distribution of water at the Children's Home.
- Also 3000 litres solar hot water system, 2 solar pumps & 3KV solar panel installed during this year.

5. SAMPARC Balgram, Jodhpur

- SAMPARC has started 4 rooms construction in Gangani, Jodhpur Balgram with 2 rooms dedicated for staff accommodation, working for the children with toilet & bathroom, 1 store room and 1 Library. Also, a running pad for sports activity of the children is in the process of development.

6. SAMPARC Shishu Kendra, Kolkata

- SAMPARC is in the process of developing 3 storey building accommodating each room for keeping additional 20 boys and 1 office room. Passed the plan for construction of rooms in Shishu Kendra.



This year overall Education progress is very good and progressing. Due to Second Wave of COVID-19, till the month of September 2021, all the Children attended online School. Later as

the Covid situation improved and as per the guidelines issued by State Government of Maharashtra, class wise Schools started by following all COVID precautionary measures.

10th std. SSC Board exam

In the Academic Year 2021-22, 66 children – 32 children from SAMPARC Children's Home and 34 children from SAMPARC Grameen Vidya Vikas Kendra, School and Hostel, Bhambarde have appeared for 10th std SSC Board exam. All the children have passed the same successfully except for 1 child from Bhaje Balgram.

In the Academic Year 2021-22, 70 children – 18 children from SAMPARC Children's Home, 39 children from SAMPARC Grameen Vidya Vikas Kendra, School and Junior College, Bhambarde and 13 children from SAMPARC Lily Junior College, Malavli have appeared for 12th std HSC Board exam. All the children have passed the same successfully except for 1 child from Bhaje Balgram studying in SAMPARC Lily Junior College was unable to pass 12th std in one subject and from SAMPARC Bhambarde Junior College 4 children were unable to pass 12th std HSC Board Exam.

All through SAMPARC is looking after the orphan children in Bhaje, Poynad, Shel-Pimpalgaon, Bal Asha Ghar, Gangani, and Kolkata Centres. The main strength of running these centres is good counselling of the inmates, standard nutrition and special coaching. For each centre sports, cultural activities, drawing, painting, yoga, and self-development are the key subjects and activities for the children. Children are also given strength in reading, speaking, general knowledge, and taking care of small children by the grownup children.

The most important aspect is providing the environment where children feel a loving situation and interaction. In addition, the social workers, in house teachers, tutors, other working people & officials take care of the mental & physical need of the children. All Children's Homes are having adequate number of staff to manage the activities of the children. Children are taken for excursion, picnic, and various exposure visits. They also participate in the cultural programs, competition and sports.

This year SAMPARC had volunteers to work with the children in the field of education, mental development and attitude building to create their goals. SAMPARC staff is adequately involved with staff and maintaining various records, documents and provide various report to the government and other authorities. I am thankful to all Volunteers who provided a huge support by conducting online sessions for children before & after Covid period.



This year SAMPARC is supporting 117 grownup boys and girls passed out from various SAMPARC Children's Home for their Higher education. 35 children in 11th std; 18 children in 12th std; 17 children in Graduation First Year; 18 children in Graduation Second year; 01 child in Graduation Final year; 05 children in post-graduation; 16 children in ITI; 1 child in VTC course and 6 children in Nursing Course.

Among 6 children who are pursuing 4-year RNM Nursing Course in Bell Air College of Nursing in Panchagani, 1 senior child – Sakshi Patil is doing internship and senior 5 children are pursuing First Year.

810 children from Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh & West Bengal are supported under Community Education Support Program.

- 167 students from 8th to 10th std are receiving Quality Education Support from villages surrounding SAMPARC Malavli Centre of Maval block of Pune District. The focus of the project is to provide quality education to the students, remove the fear of Maths & Science and encourage children to take up Science & Maths after 10th std for higher education.
- 96 children from Jr. Kg to 10th std are supported in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh.
- 547 children from Kolkata, South 24 Parganas & Sundarbans (West) receive Education & Computer Literacy support.



SAMPARC is aiming to convert all its centres under solar power consumption system. In SAMPARC Malavli centre lot of progress has been made in this aspect similarly Bhambarde and Shel-Pimpalgaon is improving to convert its power consumption pattern. Malavli centre has been linked with the Power Grid.

In Bhaje & Shel-Pimpalgaon Centre where 1 Digital Smart TV was provided for facilitating Online Classes & Sessions.

SAMPARC has made excellent progress in developing Vocational & Industrial Training program. During the period 2021-22, 619 rural students received Skill Development Training. ITI 206 students, VTC 165

students and for MKCL Courses 248 students were enrolled this year. All competent & qualified staff are working tirelessly to improve the training of the students. The Centre is following various milestones, measuring teaching goal with the students to keep standard of theoretical & practical classes as per the Industrial requirement.

SAMPARC Medical Centre which is been mostly known for its visit of Mobile Medical Van in 15 villages. During the period June 2021 to March 2022, 7167 patients were treated & benefitted. Out of 7167 patients – 6151 patients received treatment and 1016 patients were benefitted from Health Camps & awareness programs. SAMPARC is also running IPD where the local level patients are given treatment by Child specialist, dentistry, optician and general physician.

SAMPARC Schools from the month of October 2021 started offline classes, gradually students started to come in the Schools also exams were conducted offline by following all COVID safety norms.

One of the important Project of SAMPARC is Tribal Community Development. Inspite of the COVID Pandemic this year remarkable target has achieved. SAMPARC reached 796 children to facilitate their education in 59 ZP schools with regular follow up. SAMPARC has enrolled 133 Tribal Boys and Girls in SAMPARC Bhambarde School and Hostel.

The most achievable progress is that 13 tribal students are pursuing Higher education in ITI, Nursing & Graduation. Among 13 students one student completed his ITI and is employed and 3 tribal Girls have completed their nursing course and are now employed in hospital at Mulshi. Also important to mention that Kumar Katkar mayur Yogesh scored 75.40% in HSC Board Exam & stood 4th in school and this year first time in the area 11 Tribal students passed 10th std SSC Board Exams & 9 Tribal Students passed 12th std HSC Board Exams with good percentage.

A survey was conducted based on the basic data and it was found that about 25% financial improvement was achieved with more than 782 tribal Kathkari families of 96 villages of Mulshi, Maval, Velha and Bhore Talukas of Pune district through livelihood program.



This year SAMPARC had 02 online Governing Council Meetings, 1 online Annual General Meeting and 02 online Advisory Board Meetings.

It is very important to mention that SAMPARC completed all statutory requirements of the Government. We are glad to inform that SAMPARC has received FCRA Renewal for the next 5 years 2022-27 from Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi.

As per advice of eClerx Services Limited SAMPARC is working with the ATMA Team. ATMA Team conducted The Life Stage Survey with core team of SAMPARC to determine the stage of development

organisation is at different Organisational Development (OD) areas. It assessed the organisation across 9 functions covering twenty-five subtopics and 80 elements. The 9 OD Areas are Strategy, Programs, Leadership, Fundraising, Human Resources, Marketing, Finance, Monitoring & Evaluation and Governance. The overall Life Stage of SAMPARC is 4 out of 5. As per the score of Life Stage Survey ATMA team is working with SAMPARC Core Team to broaden the organisational strategies that the organisation can implement in order to strengthen the programmes and the daily operations of the organisation. ATMA team has guided SAMPARC Team to develop revised Vision, Mission of the organization along with Program Goals.

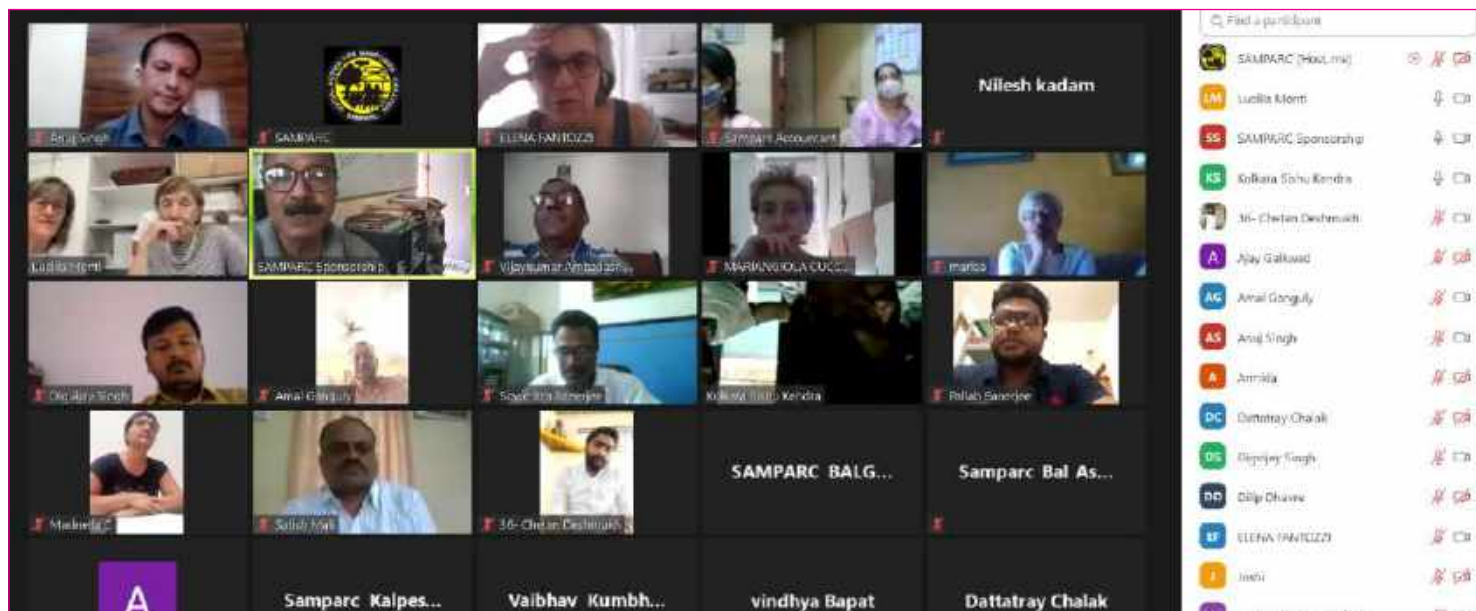

During the academic year 2021-22, 263 students were enrolled in the School & Junior College. Along with the academic curriculum, the school encourages and provides training to the students in Sports, Yoga, Art & craft and Computers for overall development of the students. The School is equipped with a Digital Classroom for facilitating e-Learning, Computer Classroom with enough Computers for Practical Learning, a library and a huge playground. Also special coaching and support along with career guidance is provided to SSC & HSC students. The School is working under the guidance of Headmaster Shri Dattatray Chalak along with 19 school staff.



HOSTEL – The students in School have separate hostel facilities for boys and girls along with medical support facility. During the academic year 2021-22, 226 students were enrolled in hostel in the school premises. Among these 226 students, 133 Katakari students are enrolled under educational support. SAMPARC is conducting Skill development courses & is preparing for Affiliation under NSDC. The project in Varanasi is run under Project In charge Mr. Digvijay Singh. Three courses are presently run viz. Fashion design, Beautician and Computer, for the rural youth of the Baragaon and surrounding villages of Varanasi District of Uttar Pradesh. Fashion Designing Course: 18 students enrolled in Basic & Advance Fashion Designing Course from the Institute. Basic Course is for a period of 3 months and Advance course for a period of 6 months which helps them to be completely trained and employable.

SAMPARC Medical Centre works under the guidance of Medical Director Dr. Satish Patil, M.S, LLB, LLM. The Centre also organizes health camps and health awareness sessions for the rural people by doctors from Pune and Mumbai who are specialized in their respective fields. The Centre also takes care of medical needs of the children of SAMPARC Children's Home, Bhaje, and Bal Asha Ghar.

After Second wave of COVID-19 from June 2021 phase wise SAMPARC Medical Centre started to provide medical health support to poor & needy people. During the period June 2021 to March 2022, total 7167 beneficiaries received health care through SAMPARC Medical Centre. Through OPD, Dental, Pediatric, Dermatology, Medical Mobile Clinic & Vision Care department 6151 beneficiaries received health care and 1016 beneficiaries benefitted through Health camps. - On 27th January 2022, health awareness session was conducted by Dr. Sanding Rahane on topic "Blood Pressure, Diabetes & Health Talk" and 37 beneficiaries attended the same from Village Kothurne.
- On 16th February 2022, Pediatric Check-up Camp & Health Talk on topic "Pneumonia" was conducted by Dr. Milind Kanjalkar and 37 beneficiaries attended the same from Village Thugaon.
- On 21st February 2022, health awareness session was conducted by Dr. Amita Patil on topic "Anemia & Calcium Deficiency" and 28 beneficiaries attended the same from Village Sawantwadi.
- On 24th February 2022, health awareness session was conducted by Dr. Aarvind Aarte on topic "HIV-AIDS & Prevention" and 11 beneficiaries attended the same from Village Karunj.

To create Socio-economic Development among Poor Tribal Community of Mulshi Taluka, Dist. Pune, SAMPARC Tribal Development Project is working in 60 Villages by providing Livelihood Support to the Tribal Families and Education Support to their Children.

796 Katkari Children are enrolled in different Schools in Mulshi Taluka and 682 Families are supported under Livelihood Support Programme. The entire activities have been supported by eClerx Services Ltd. since 2014.

EDUCATION SUPPORT

During the period 2021-22, 796 Tribal Students-387 Girls and 409 Boys received Education Support under this Project. Among 796 Tribal students 650 students are enrolled in 59 Zilla Parishad Primary Schools; 133 students are enrolled in SAMPARC School & Hostel at Bhambarde and 13 students are enrolled in higher education. All the students have received Education material and SAMPARC Team takes regular follow up with Teachers regarding the progress and attendance of students in School.

As per the lockdown guidelines of Government the Schools reopened after the second wave of COVID-19 and as the situation improved, SAMPARC Team took all efforts to ensure children are back to School. All the students have appeared for Final exams and have performed well.

SAMPARC Team regularly interacts with the parents and explains them about the importance of Education in Child's Life. Now, Children attend School regularly and also the Dropout Rate has decreased to a large extent. The Participation of Tribal Students in all Academic & Sports Activities has improved drastically.



The Tribal Children are now attending School regularly and are studying hard to score Good Grades. This is a really Great Achievement as these Students as well as their Parents had no idea of Formal Education earlier and after the intervention of this Project, they now discuss their Higher Education and Career Opportunities.

In the Academic Year 2021-22, Kumar Katkar Muyar Yogesh scored 75.40% in HSC Board Exam & stood 4th in school and this year first time in the area 11 Tribal student passed 10th std SSC Board Exams & 9 Tribal Students passed 12th std HSC Board Exams with good percentage. Among 13 tribal students pursuing Higher education one student completed his ITI and 3 tribal Girls have completed their nursing course and are now employed in hospital at Mulshi.

LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT

During the period 21-22, under Livelihood Programme 100 Families have received Livelihood Support. SAMPARC Team is now working with 682 Katkari Families, (i.e. 582 Families supported during Previous Years with additional 100 Families during this Year).

This Year, SAMPARC Team has reached 100 families and provided Livelihood Support like Bricks making business, Electrician, Dry Fish Shop, Fishing Cold Fridge, Fish Center, Fishing Boat, Fishing Net, Flour Mill Centre, Grass /Dry Wood Cutter Machine, Goat Keeping, Mason Tools, Mini Shops, Plumbing Items, Sewing Machine, Welding Machine etc.

Livelihood Support to Tribal Families has impacted in Two Ways - it has reduced Migration of Tribal Families Tremendously and since Parents are not migrating Children are continuing school without any hindrance. The School Dropout Rate has reduced drastically. Tribal Parents are settled in villages now as they have a regular source for earning and also they are making efforts to increase their Income with the regular Guidance & Support of SAMPARC Team.

Livelihood Support has helped to increase the Income Level up to 25 % and the Additional Financial Income is utilized for Domestic purposes exclusively.



DOCUMENTATION

Since 2014, SAMPARC Team has been doing continuous follow up with the Government for proper Documents for Tribal Families which will help them in Future to get Government Benefit.

During the period 2021-22, SAMPARC Team completed and received documents for tribal beneficiaries are as follows: 232 Aadhar Card, 105 Jan Dhan Account, 214 Pan Card, 141 Caste Certificates, 48 Ration Card, 10 Voter Card and 155 e-shram Card of tribal beneficiaries.

Due to the documentation work beneficiaries have received the benefits of Govt schemes like Khavati schemes 918 beneficiaries, Tokti Cyclone Support 15 beneficiaries, Gharkul Yojna 3 beneficiaries, Scholarship support for 17 Children, PM Ujwala Gas Scheme 66 beneficiaries, other tribal schemes 105 and PM Matrutva Vandana scheme 20 for Tribal families.

HEALTH SERVICE & DE-ADDICTION

Right from the beginning, when SAMPARC Team approached Tribal Families, one of the biggest problems faced was Addiction of the Target Community to Alcohol, which was the root cause of all problems.

During the period 2021-22, SAMAPRC Team organized 25 health camps at Project location in which 532 tribal individuals benefited from the Health Camps. As per the need, doctors provided medicine and explained regularly about the importance of cleanliness & hygiene to Tribal families. Today because of all the efforts, the Tribal Families follow the advice of the doctor and are taking proper care of hygiene and personal care. SAMPARC tribal team initiated Health camps & De-addiction camps, showed Social movie for health Awareness conducted Street Plays at various tribal hamlets and also showed documentary on Women health and created mass sensitization on addiction issues. Resource Person also shared valuable information on personal health, hygiene and awareness, precautionary measures to avoid communicable disease. Also information was given about Kitchen garden and Anaemia free women.

With the help of experts from local area, SAMPARC Team conducted 36 De-addiction camps at Project Location, in which 386 tribal individuals participated. The outcome which we observed after the de-addiction camp is that about 9 % individuals have quit alcohol.

SAMPARC Higher Education Project took shape in the year 2001, now in the academic year 2020-21, 117 senior children from different Centres of SAMPARC Balgram pursued Higher Education in various fields under the guidance of Higher Education Coordinator – Adv. Mr. Paresh Khadilkar, M.A. Psychology, LLB and Mr. Ajay Gaikwad.

After the second wave of COVID-19 and as the situation improved and as per guidelines of Government the colleges started offline from November 2021. The colleges started focussing on completion of syllabus and preparing the students for offline exams. 11th & 12th std exams were conducted as per schedule in the month of March 2022. Graduation, Post-Graduation students' exams were conducted in the month of July 2022 and the results are awaited. 2019-21 Batch ITI students' final exams which were postponed due to COVID were conducted in the month of January 2022 and 2020-22 Batch ITI student's final exam were conducted as per regular schedule in the month of August 2022. VTC students also appeared for final exams.

Senior Children pursuing Higher Education receive guidance right from College Admission, requisite documents for opening Bank Accounts, like AADHAAR, PAN Card, Voter Id & Orphan Certificate for College Admission. After admission in college, transport facility, hostel accommodations are facilitated by SAMPARC Higher Education Department. Children are provided with necessary books, educational materials, uniforms etc and extra coaching classes are arranged as required. After admission the Counsellors monitor the progress of the students regularly through visits to the colleges where children are studying and through regular telephonic conversation with the children. Different Sessions for Counselling & Career Guidance, Moral Support & Motivation and Skill Development are conducted for the Children under Higher Education. Volunteer Involvement Activities also enrich the Programs.

Academic Results

11th standard – 35 children appeared for Final Exam and all children passed the same successfully. 2 children passed in Distinction, 6 children passed in First division, 26 children passed in Second Division and 1 child passed in Third Division.

12th standard – 18 children appeared for 12 std HSC Board exam and all children have passed the same successfully except for one student. 2 children passed in Distinction, 7 children passed in First Division, 6 children passed in Second Division and 2 children passed in Third Division.

Final exams results of Graduation & Post Graduation children are awaited.

RNM Nursing Course - Among 6 children who are pursuing 4-year RNM Nursing Course in Bell Air College of Nursing in Panchagani, 1 senior child – Sakshi Patil is doing internship and senior 5 children are pursuing First Year.



ITI – Among 16 senior children who were pursuing ITI, 5 senior children from 2019-21 ITI Batch have appeared for Final Exam in January 2022, and passed the same. Out of 5 children 4 children are now employed. 11 children pursuing ITI in First Year & Second Year have appeared for Final Exams in August 2022 and their results are awaited.

VTC – Rushikesh Shinde completed VTC Wireman Course and is now employed.

After completing Higher Education and Skill Development Courses, the Children are helped to search suitable Job. Following are details of senior children who are employed this year –

Match-making is also another important help by this Project to the Orphan Children to find suitable Life-partners and to have their own family. During this year 3 senior girl children and 1 senior boy were married and they are now leading a happy married family life.



SAMPARC COMMUNITY EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAMM

Education is the Prime Aspect of Development of Poor – Underprivileged Community Children. In Rural area or Urban Slum area, Children from poor families remain deprived of Formal Education and as a result, no development ever happened in these community – they remained Poor.

Because of Poverty - Education of the Children is often neglected and most of the time the Children leave School and start working as Child Labour to support their Family.

Under Community Education Support Programme, SAMPARC provides Education Support to Poor and Needy Children of underprivileged Community of the Society. Children are provided with all Education and School Stationary items to motivate the Children to attend School regularly. The Teaching Staff in each Centre helps the Children in studies and also takes follow-up of their attendance in School and Educational Progress.

SAMPARC EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAMME IN MAVAL, PUNE, MAHARASHTRA

167 students from 8th to 10 std are receiving Quality Education Support under Community Education Support Program. The students are from poor rural community of villages surrounding SAMPARC Malavli Centre of Maval block of Pune District. The focus of the project is to provide quality education to the students, remove the fear of Maths & Science and encourage children to take up Science & Maths after 10th std for higher education. The Quality Education Classes are conducted in village- Sadapur, Gharkul, Patan, Bhaje, Karla, Devle, Malavali and Boraj of Maval Block.



SAMPARC EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAMME IN VARNASI, UTTAR PRADESH

96 children from Jr Kg to 10th std are receiving Education Support under Community Education Support Program. Tutor conducts classes for Children 6 days in week at the Centre after attending regular School. The Beneficiaries under this Program are from very Poor Situation from 7 surrounding villages. Because of Poverty, Education of the Children is neglected. Children attend Government run Schools. SAMPARC Tutor teaches English, Math & Science subjects.



SAMPARC EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAMME IN THE VILLAGES NEAR KOLKATA, WEST BENGAL

Under this Programme 547 Children receive Education & Computer Literacy support.

Sundarbans (West)

The villages in the delta region are very backward and large part of the population suffers from un-employability and poverty. The families are agriculture daily wage earners, labourers, manual rickshaw pullers, masons, and similar other livelihoods with very little earning. As a result of the socio-economic poor condition, the parents have no awareness on school education of their children. They do not send children to school. High possibilities are there to indulge in child labour to earn basic needs. The people do not have an exposure to bring betterment in their lives. Child marriage is another issue that arise due to such challenging lifestyle.

SAMPARC's intervention is to bring such children to school and ensure they attend the school regularly. Next, provide special tuition classes to these children, many of whom are first generation school goers, so that they can cope up with the standard progress of the school. Since the children come from very challenging socio-economic background, they need special care and help for education.

The focus is to give basic literacy of the children and then improve their progress in the subjects of Bengali, Mathematics and English.

Three such community education projects are initiated by SAMPARC. The projects are in the villages Jalabheria, West Jamtala village 1 and West Jamtala village 2.

Village Jalabheria

40 children, both boys and girls in the age group 5-11 years are the beneficiaries of the Project.

West Jamtala village 1

80 children from 1st to 8th standard are the beneficiaries of the Project.

West Jamtala village 2

35 children, both boys and girls in the age group 1st to 5th standard are the beneficiaries of the Project. The children are from the Munda and Santhal communities.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAM IN SOUTH 24 PARGANAS**Mandir Bazar/Krishnadevpur**

40 children, both boys and girls in the age group of 5th to 9th standard are beneficiaries of the Project. The project is running since last 7 years.

Dhananjaypur

38 children, both boys and girls in the age group 5th to 9th standard are beneficiaries of the Project.

Village Bahirkancholi

34 Students are beneficiaries of the Project.

Sundarbans Kashinagar, Mathurapur, Raidighi, Milan More

Five teachers teach 200 children in Computer literacy and English.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAM IN KOLKATA**Haridevpur**

80 Students are beneficiaries of the Project.

The impact of the project created tremendous help to the families belonging to poor socio-economic group and is motivating children to attend school regularly.



SAMPARC WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROJECT LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT PROGRAM, PUNE

Since 1992, SAMPARC is working for the upliftment of Rural Women of Maval Taluka, District Pune by imparting various Training Programs to enhance the Capacity, create Awareness about Various Schemes of Government, about Rights of Women, conducting Income Generation Programs to Rural Women which have helped them to become Independent.

SAMPARC ABHINAV SHG COPERATIVE SOCIETY

SAMPARC started the concept of Self Help Group (SHG) and subsequently a Registered Co-operative Society was formed. 1194 women are shareholders of the Registered Co-Operative Society. During the period 2021-22 Rs.64,00,000/- amount was given as loan to 60 rural women for business & domestic purpose. Regular Meetings of shareholders of SAMPARC Abhinav Mahila Patsanstha (SAMPARC Abhinav Women Credit Cooperative Society) are held.

The challenging COVID Pandemic period affected the regular functioning of the Team but as the situation improved after second wave & as per unlock guidelines of Government the Team started working offline in rural interior villages.



SAMPARC LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT PROGRAM, AMBEGAON TALUKA PUNE

In partnership with AFARM, SAMPARC is working on Gramin Mahila Udyojakta Shakshmikaran Project in Ambegaon Block of District Pune in 4 villages - Karegaon, Pargaon, Thugaon and Kurwandi. The project is for promoting the house hold entrepreneurship activities through livelihood support for 1100 women beneficiaries of the Project. One Cluster Manager and five CRP from local villages implement the activities of the project.

The project mainly focused on conducting trainings on Entrepreneurship Development Program; Sheti Shala (Farmers Training Session), Digital Literacy, Samajik Suraksha/EDP, Collective Procurement, Animal Husbandry and other Agriculture allied activities

The Monitoring of Activities and overall responsibility of project maintenance and implementation is taken by Gram Sangh (The Village Committee) of their respective villages in collaboration with PRI of their respective villages. The overall responsibility to monitor and own the project Gram Sangh of the villages plays an important role to recover and maintain the updates of the income generated through individual livelihood activity or the Gram Sangh livelihood activity.

The progress of project is measured regularly by AFARM team along with field inspection and documents verification periodically. Gram Sangh meetings are conducted and attended by Cluster Manager and SAMPARC Project head of Head office.

Highlights of the Year- 21-22

- The Revolving Fund is distributed to the applicant member of the producer group from selected villages and only once the amount is given to start the livelihood activity.
- Recovery of the Revolving Fund is carried and accordingly the Gram Sangh rotates the amount with minimum interest rate of 2% from the women beneficiary.
- The women beneficiaries have received various Government schemes under the project support and their income has raised satisfactorily.
- Amount recovered is deposited in Bank account of the Gram Sangh,
- Various Trainings on EDP, Digital literacy, Sheti Shala, Collective procurement and Business development has been conducted successfully.
- Vaccination of the livestock completed by Veterinary doctor.
- 15 Women Beneficiaries have joined ATMA Scheme- It aims at making extension system farmer driven and farmer accountable by way of new institutional arrangements for technology dissemination in the form of an Agricultural Technology Management Agency (ATMA) at district level to operationalize the extension reforms.



Impact

Out of 1100 women beneficiaries 47% women have started their income generation activity with livelihood support at Individual level.

All five villages have started their Gram Sangh business and recovery ratio of the Revolving Fund distributed is 98%.

82 % women have availed the benefits of various Government schemes introduced in project phase.

All the women beneficiaries have attended all the project trainings conducted.

Gram Sangh will bear the responsibility of Project in this last phase of implementation accordingly their roles and responsibilities of Gram Sangh members is been facilitated by SAMPARC and AFARM Team.

Transparency in all financial transactions is maintained by the Gram Sangh and CRP which is audited by SAMPARC accountant and Auditor.

SAMPARC DHAGA & ROSHNI PROJECT

SAMPARC is implementing Dhaga Project for Women Empowerment and Roshni Project for Preventive Health Care of Women and Anaemia control in Managaon Taluka, Raigad District - supported by TATA Hydro Power Company Limited since 2019.

DHAGA PROJECT - PROJECT FOR WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

“DHAGA” Project for Women Empowerment is implemented by strengthening 26 Self Help Group Women and enhancing the Income of Women Beneficiaries through Tailoring classes to transform them into skilled manpower.



Highlights of the Year- 21-22

- 50 Women beneficiaries received training in Tailoring from surrounding village of the project location. 50 beneficiaries have received Tailoring course completion certificate.
- Completed Dashasutri trainings for Producer groups (SHG).
- Resource Person Ms. Raksha Tai conducted Dashsutri training session for 26 SHGs, 40 beneficiaries attended the same.

- Resource Person Ms. Raksha Tai conducted Audit and Book Keeping session and 40 beneficiaries attended the same.
- Tata Power, Bhira employee conducted Tata Employee volunteering Engagement activity for business promotion and 110 beneficiaries attended the same.
- Resource Person Ms. Raksha Tai conducted session on Branding, Packaging, labelling and marketing training and 42 beneficiaries attended the same.
- Resource Person Ms. Rubina Kagadi conducted Tailoring Training Sessions and 50 beneficiaries attended the same.
- 30 Beneficiaries Participated in Exhibition at Bhira Tata Power plants at Khopoli, Bhivpuri, and Mangaon
- By Garment sale, Dhaga project generated income of Rupees 3,78,000/- The products included Plazo, One Piece Kurti, Gowns, Top, Masks and Pillow cover etc. They participated in various exhibitions for promoting sale of garment products.
- 1 lakh deposited as FD in favour of PRERANA Gram Sangh account.

IMPACT OF DHAGA PROJECT

- 50 women have acquired the tailoring skill and started generating income and fulfilling their domestic financial needs.
- 6 groups have started their group business activity like Dhoop Kandi, Hand wash, Agarbatti, Candle making and Paper plates and Sweets making business.

ROSHNI PROJECT FOR WOMEN HEALTH CARE - PREVENTIVE MEASURES AGAINST ANEMIA

Highlights of the Year 21-22

- The project covered the 700 women beneficiaries. The Project was facilitated by trained peer educators along with the support of Government health workers like ANM, Asha worker, Anganwadi teacher, MPW in project villages.
- As an alternative activity to cover Anaemia and Malnourishment, 250 women beneficiaries received Seeds for a Kitchen Garden which will be planted in Back yards of the Beneficiaries and it will help them have Fresh Vegetables from their Kitchen Garden and will improve their Health.



- Online Trainings were conducted by Dr Nitin Pise and Offline Health Camps were conducted by Dr. Thombre and Dr. Ingole to control anaemia.
- Dr. Ingole from Primary Health Centre, Shirolu conducted Health Camp on topic "Health and Nutrition for anaemia control" and 120 beneficiaries including Asha Workers, Anganwadi teachers and MPW (Multipurpose Health Workers attended the same.
- During Pandemic period COVID19 vaccination of 526 women beneficiaries was completed at Shirolu Primary Health Centre and at Patnus Primary Health Care Centre.
- Resource Person Ms. Rohini Sanap and Mr. Sandip Mohite and team conducted training session for 24 trainees on topic Women Health and anaemia for Peer educators training.



IMPACT OF ANEMIA HEALTH PROJECT

- 180 women beneficiaries have planted Kitchen Garden seeds at their backyard and are using the fresh vegetables in their daily diet.
- Through trained Peer Educator's maximum anaemic beneficiaries got knowledge of proper health diet and about importance of kitchen gardens seeds and they are following diet accordingly.
- 15200 Iron & Folic Acid tablets received from Government health department were distributed through Peer Educators and all the beneficiaries received benefit of the same.
- Peer Educators are now trained with preventive health project Objectives. They are facilitating their work to control anaemia among women in their respective villages.
- Government field machinery is supporting project objectives.
- COVID 19 Vaccination completed of all 526 women beneficiaries through Shirolu Primary Health Centre.

SAMPARC Family Counselling Centre is recognized under Maharashtra State Women's Commission.

The main aim of SAMPARC Family Counselling Centre at Malavli is to create Awareness about Domestic Violence, Women's Rights & other issues related to women & their respective families. This Centre functions as a service / resource provider to cater to women's domestic problems.

The main purpose of the center is Protecting Women from Domestic Violence and also the center gives Educational & Career Counseling and Legal Guidance to Women. At the village level, Workshops and Awareness Programs are arranged on various subjects of Women's Welfare & Rights along with Government Schemes to benefit and uplift Poor Rural Women. Empowering Women helps in Confidence Building among them and hence enable them to acquire Equal Respect in the Family as well as in the Society and to Fight for their Rights.

The challenging COVID Pandemic period affected the regular functioning of the Family Counselling Centre drastically. As the COVID situation slowly improved, by following all COVID protocols the Counsellor started visiting villages of the Project area and started networking with local police stations. Counsellor Ms. Priyanka received new cases and started working on 6 cases.

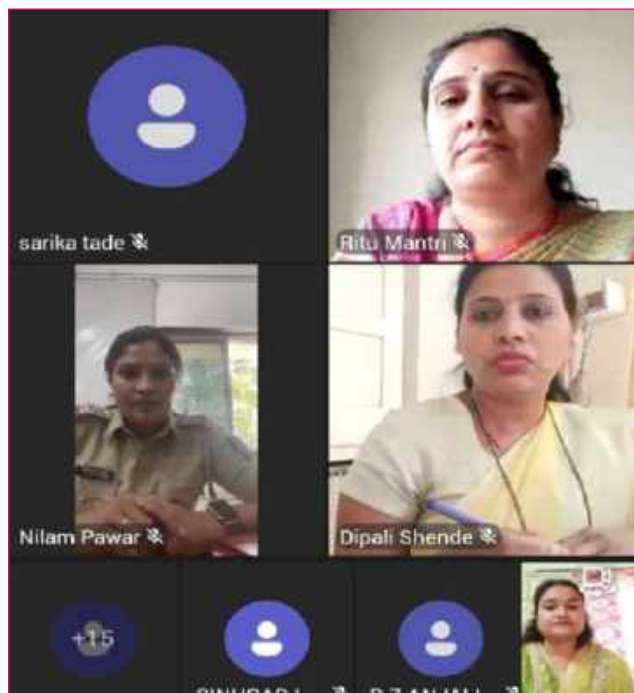
SAMPARC Counselor also attends 1 day in a week in the Vadgaon Maval Court Legal Aid Cell as a Retrial mediator to solve cases and conduct counseling of Filed cases i.e., for Pre-litigation - a process for resolving the cases before the lawsuit being officially filed and court proceedings begin. The pre-litigation process also includes mediation, which saves time and money for both the parties.



The Counsellor with the purpose to solve the Cases remains in regular touch with Local Police Stations, concerned Government Offices, attends and conducts meetings to create Awareness about the Services of the Centre.
